### **DEEP LEARNING DAY: "ENTERPRISE"**

The highlight of a very busy week of events at school this week was our Deep Learning Day on Thursday based on the theme of "Enterprise".

All the boys were off timetable for the day and events, many with outside facilitators, were tailored to each year group. Year 7 focussed on becoming a young apprentice, brainstorming product ideas, marketing and presentation skills; Year 8 took the "Ryman Enterprise Challenge"; Year 9 had a range of activities: What is enterprise?, Feeding Britain's Future, Young Enterprise Challenge, Coding, Apprenticeships and What are my skills? Year 10 divided into groups for Careers carousels, a "Hot Seat" session where a guest talked about their job, plus Who am I? and Leadership sessions.

Year 11 pupils had already been involved in a Careers event on Monday with the alumni network started up by ex-William Ellis students, "Future First", focussing on self-presentation skills such as handshakes, so on Thursday, all Year 11s had a session on preparing well for their forthcoming exams, and a special one-to-one guidance interview with either a Head of Year, a current sixth form tutor or member of the senior staff about post-16 options. We are hoping that most will remain at William Ellis for sixth form.

# **Biology Roadshow**



On Monday, students from St. George's University of London came and delivered two one hour workshops with Year 10 Triple Science (on Radiography) and Year 9 Set 1 (on Paramedicine). The university students were a mix of a fourth year medical student, a first year biochemistry student and a third year trainee paramedic. As you can see our students were well engaged and inspired to learn about the careers being discussed in both sessions.
