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Dear families

I write first of all with a thank you to you all for your efforts to help us provide high quality education to our students. We have seen an improvement this week in student attendance and punctuality to school, as well as the number of students who are coming properly equipped with uniform or PE kit and for lessons. As we go into the final week before half term this supports them in having successful, enjoyable and productive days in school.

Remote learning

We also have 85% of students who are now accessing Microsoft Teams regularly to access and complete their homework, and our recent student voice survey indicates that for young people at home the regular digital access provides them with support and independent learning tasks. The students who had been isolating for two weeks also told us that they felt best supported by a mixture of independent work, structured online content and live interactions with their teacher. This is valuable information and will inform our provision going forward.

If a student is struggling to log in to Microsoft Teams at home, or they do not have a device with a keyboard (e.g. laptop or computer) to do this from, please contact their form tutor so that we can provide additional support. This is critical in making sure that we can support students if they do have to miss school at any point during this year.

Year 11 times of the day

To support Year 11 with developing their study skills and curriculum catch up, we have decided to make changes to the school day for Year 11. From Monday, 19th October, Year 11 will re-start registration in the morning and so will need to be in school for an 8:35am registration. They will also register in the afternoon.

The reason for the continued staggered start is to help TfL maintain less congested bus services. Students should walk to school if they can – certainly if they live 1km away or less.

Mask wearing

As you know, the government have now moved London to a higher coronavirus alert level – we attach further information from Camden Council. We are aware that some students feel more confident when wearing face coverings and when others do. Whilst we have been advised that brief contact in corridors within bubbles is relatively safe, **face coverings are a sensible precautionary measure to protect people in the school.** Students travelling on public transport should have a face mask with them every day. Disposable face coverings are only designed to be used for a very short period of time and certainly not for a whole day. We are recommending that students have a number of reusable face coverings which can be washed regularly. If your child is wearing a face mask, please watch this video with them <u>WHO: how to wear a face mask safely</u>.
