In terms of dates for the next Working Weekends in 2021, below are the provisional dates:

- 8, 9, 10th October 2021 (Autumn Working Weekend)

The Mill is a fabulous resource to support our school Outdoor Education curriculum and camp programme, which could not run as normal last year. With the relaxation in restrictions since March we are now able to make some plans for the summer and autumn terms for Key Stage 3 and the Duke of Edinburgh programme to restart – watch this space soon for more details!

### Assessments for Years 11 and 13, and some Year 12 students

As you know, students who would have sat exams this year are completing in-school assessments during this half term. These are mainly in class, with Year 13 also having a short exam window  $17^{th} - 19^{th}$  May. Students and their families have been given a timetable of when Year 11 assessments will take place, and  $6^{th}$  form students have been told individually by their teachers. It is critical that <u>all</u> students attend every assessment and all the preparation lessons leading up to them between now and the end of term so that they make the most of the time they have available.

The key dates for students are as follows:

- 28<sup>th</sup> May: final date for students to complete all work to be considered for teacher assessment
- 7<sup>th</sup> 17<sup>th</sup> June: period of teacher checking and moderation, during which students may be called upon to come into school if there is any work missing
  - 28<sup>th</sup> June: LaSWAP 6<sup>th</sup> form taster day (to be finally confirmed)
- 10<sup>th</sup> August: A Level and GCE results day
- 12<sup>th</sup> August: GCSE results day
- 12<sup>th</sup> August: LaSWAP admissions interviews

#### **Admissions and Summer School**

We are pleased to report that we have been able to offer 130 places to current Year 6 students who will be joining us in September, and currently have a long waiting list for places. Year 6 students and their families will be joining us for transition interviews on  $5^{th}$  and  $8^{th}$  May and should have already received the times of their interviews by email – anyone who has not should contact the school by email. As happens every year, we will be running a fun-packed summer school  $23^{rd} - 27^{th}$  August so that students feel established and at home when they join us on  $1^{st}$  September. We are working in the coming weeks with our Year 8-10 students to build a new team of students to visit primary schools to support successful transition work.

## Mobile phone use outside school

Some of the questions raised by parents who I spoke to during the March WESPA event were about mobile phone use and technology. We have just finished collecting substantial feedback from groups of students and staff about their views on mobile phone and technology use in school and will be writing to families about this again before half term. However, it has also been brought to our attention, unfortunately, that William Ellis students have been using their phones irresponsibly outside school. Specifically, this has involved filming others without permission and sharing these films and other images on social media. Please work with us to remind young people that it is not acceptable, in or outside school, to film other people without their consent and that doing so, or sharing such images and videos, may lead to investigation by the police and potentially compromises the safety of others. If you have particular concerns about a student's use of technology or the internet, please contact their tutor in the first instance.

### **Water bottles**

As we come into warmer weather it is important that students keep well hydrated by drinking water. Students must bring their own water bottle to school which they can refill from the special refill taps. The traditional water fountains remain turned off as part of our Covid risk assessment.
