



News Update (22nd October 2021)

Dear families

Welcome to this edition of our newsletter, that marks the end of this first half term and a very busy few weeks, especially in PE and Art. I'd like to start by thanking you for all the efforts that you have put in to support students in their learning and lives at home and outside of school, and also to our teachers and support staff for the work that they do with the students during the school day.

Before students return on Monday 1st November, we are asking all families to complete Lateral Flow Tests so that any students with a COVID infection do not return to school. This is a precaution while we know that COVID rates are increasing. Students should have test kits that were issued last week – if not they can be collected free of charge from local pharmacies – for more information please see this government guidance.

As well as this, our Year 11 students have completed assessments in all their subjects that will enable teachers to evaluate their progress in what they have learned this half term, and also what they have remembered and understood from Year 10. These students now have a critical period in November to prepare for their GCSE mock exams which takes place before Christmas.

If you are a Year 11 parent and you did not attend the Parents' Information Evening this Monday, 18th October and you also didn't receive an information pack by email, please contact Mr Scott at scott@williamellis.camden.sch.uk so that you get all the information you need about the period preparing for exams.

Year 13 Applied Science students have been organising work experience placements in this first half term. Maya Norton-Clarke completed a work experience placement at the Royal Free Hospital last month.

Maya writes:

"Between the 6th - 17th of September I was lucky enough to secure an opportunity for work experience at the Royal Free Hospital in the Centre of Clinical Microbiology.

Amongst other things, I looked at COVID-19 SARS under the microscope and I observed the Tuberculosis trials, which included looking at methods to treat patients who are drug-resistant to conventional tuberculosis treatments. I also saw how sequencing works (this is used to find the function of genes).


Despite not being able to do any practical work, as I wasn't insured, it gave me a good insight into what a career in microbiology entails and how much it contributes towards the production of new medicines.

The experience provided the clarity I sought in deciding what degree and career path I would like to pursue, and I encourage others to look for work experience in anything which you may be considering as a career."
