



News Update (3rd December 2021)

Dear families

Welcome to this edition of our newsletter, with updates from the Art and Technology Department, our librarian and City Year Team. Before this, though, I am including some important practical information about the arrangements in school for the rest of term and looking ahead to January 2022.

Masks in communal areas

As you know, all secondary schools in England were asked to reintroduce masks in communal areas as of last Monday, and this will continue for the rest of the Autumn Term. We have not yet been given any information about next term, although it is very possible that current arrangements will continue.

Thank you to families and students who have made sure that they have their own reusable and washable masks with them in school each day. Please could I ask all families to ensure that students have masks with them when they come to school. Many students will also need to use them on public transport.

Lateral flow testing

Last Friday, all students were issued with their latest lateral flow test packs to use at home. All students need to text twice weekly, and we would encourage families to do the same including through the Christmas and New Year holidays. When we return on 5th January, we have been instructed to test all students before they return to class. These tests will take place during 5th and 6th January, with online learning to support students. Further details will follow as soon as they are available.

While coronavirus rates have risen nationally across England, our rates at William Ellis have remained constant and we are optimistic that events through to the end of term can continue to take place, albeit with some modified arrangements:

Considering the recent government restrictions the number of tickets available will be limited to 120. This will allow for some social distancing in the hall. If possible, we would also request that you complete a lateral flow test on the day of the performance. The hall will be well-ventilated so it is advised to dress warmly as this will affect the temperature of the performance space. We ask that you wear a face mask for the duration of the performances.

Priority booking will be given to families with a child performing on the evening. Booking for any remaining tickets will be open to the rest of the school community later in the week.
