Sports Days 2023

This year, Sports Days will take place for different year groups at different times – we had hoped to have a day to celebrate the year's sporting successes at Hampstead Heath track but unfortunately it was not available.

The Sports Day dates are:

- Monday 19th June P4&5 (Year 9) all students will have lunch at 12:15
- Friday 23rd June P1&2 (Year 10) all students will have break at 10:50
- Wednesday 28th June P1&2 (Year 8) all students will have break at 10:50
- Wednesday 28th June P4&5 (Year 7) all students will have lunch at 12:15

On the day of their sports day, students need to come into school in their PE kit if their sports day is period 1 and 2 (years 10 and 8). They must come in in their normal uniforms if it is period 4 and 5 (years 9 and 7).

Exams and internal assessments

We would like to congratulate the Year 11 and 13 students who have worked so hard in their public exams, some of whom are now finishing. Students have shown consistently strong resilience and a sense of personal responsibility and we are very proud of them for doing so.

Year 10 exams begin next week, and Year 7 and 8 assessments continue into next week in normal lesson time. Individual arrangements have been communicated to each year group.

The date for Year 11 Presentation Evening has been changed to accommodate Eid. This event will now take place on **Tuesday 27**th **June.** In a very busy half-term it has been a challenge to find an alternative date for this event and this is the only option available to us for rescheduling presentation evening.

Year 11 students are all invited to attend the LaSWAP Taster Day on **Friday, 30**th **June.** This is an excellent opportunity for students to experience a range of KS5 lessons, as part of the guidance they receive to make informed choices at enrolment into the sixth form on Thursday, 24th August (GCSE Results Day). Students should come to the Sixth Form Centre (between PHS and WES) for 11.45am on 30th June. They do not need to wear uniform but should come prepared for a day of learning.
