# News Update (15th September 2023)



Dear families,

Welcome to this week's newsletter, which includes details of clubs and activities timetables for lunchtime and after school. We recognise that last year students wanted more clubs and you wanted more, more quickly available information about them so I hope that you find today's details helpful.

#### **Attendance**

Thank you for the support you have given students this past week to set up good routines in the morning. As a result, our overall school attendance so far this year is 95% and there are 419 students with 100% attendance.

### **Student leadership**

Next week's assemblies will introduce upcoming elections for the Student Council, who meet regularly to discuss ideas and concerns about their experiences in school. Each form will elect two representatives to the Council, who will then form committees to focus on different areas of the school, for example the canteen. William Ellis founded the school with the aim of nurturing critical, independent thinkers and the Student Council is an important part of this. The Student Council is a supportive environment, and we would encourage all students to put themselves forward for election, even if they feel nervous about doing so.

#### **School photos**

Earlier in the week, photographs were taken of all students in Years 7 and 10. Year 7 and Year 11 students also had group photos taken with their forms and tutors. Year 12 students will have their photos taken on Monday.

These images can be a keepsake in years to come when students look back on their time at William Ellis. The photos will be available for families to purchase from the photography company, H Tempest, later in the term. The school also keeps a photo of each student on record while they attend William Ellis so that they can each be identified so it is particularly important that all Year 12 students are in school for their tutorial on Monday.

#### Professional Development Days – date change

Our term dates, as always, are published on the school website at <u>William Ellis School - Term dates</u>. However, we have had to make an amendment to our published professional development days for staff:

Monday 9<sup>th</sup> October will now be a full day for students, with lessons periods 1 to 4 for Years 7-13 at this school. Students will be dismissed at 1:10pm, with lunch available for those who want it before 1:30pm. The afternoon will be used for staff professional development focused on improving assessment, teaching and learning.

Monday 30<sup>th</sup> October will now be a full professional development day, so students' first day back from half term will be Tuesday 31<sup>st</sup>. Sixth form lessons will be taking place at the other LaSWAP schools on Monday 30<sup>th</sup>.

I propose to offer one lunchtime club, along with an after school session, each week. To take full advantage of this opportunity, you will need to be fairly confident in your mathematics and reading comprehension.

We will use the AQA syllabus. I look forward to seeing you.

Please see their message below:

"The current situation over the last 2 months is that Camden Foodbank has been overwhelmed with local people going into food crisis and needing support with emergency food parcels.

We desperately looking for urgent and targeted food donations as the number of adults and children in food poverty coming into Camden Foodbank is increasing so much, we are running extremely low on food.

In April 2023 the Trussell Trust said that in the past year, more than one million children received emergency food parcels from foodbanks. This is the first time the figure has reached over one million children.

Our autumn drive is to get in as many targeted food and cash donations as possible to support local people in food crisis. Please see attachment to this email for details of targeted food required and how to donate food and money.

We would be truly grateful if you can support Camden Foodbank and the local community."
