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Dear families,

Attendance

I'd like to congratulate the following forms on their attendance this week: **11W (with 98% attendance), 10K, 9F, 8B, 8W and 7K (also 98%).** Year 7 have the best attendance overall this week, followed by Year 11. You can check an individual student's attendance using the MCAS app.

We know that some students are feeling a little unwell as we go into the winter, but it is important that students come into school every day that they are well enough to, right up to the end of term. We will be rewarding students who have excellent attendance in assemblies at the end of term.

Travel and road safety

As it gets closer to the shortest day of the year, we would advise you to help students plan to travel home from school with at least one friend or neighbour. We know that there is a risk of crime towards younger students in particular when they are travelling, more likely if they are on their own. If something does happen or students are worried, they should go to an open shop or other business to ask for help or safely make a call from their mobile phone. They can also always return to school if they are close by and need help. Please reinforce this message at home. Any incidents that take place outside school should be reported to the police by calling 999, or 101 if they are reporting after it has happened.

As you may have seen there are **emergency gas repairs on Highgate Road** outside our gates, that have also meant the pedestrian crossing has been relocated. We expect these works to last into next week at least.

Please help us to remind students that:

- The temporary traffic lights mean that morning buses will be delayed, so they need to leave extra time to travel to school
- That roads should be crossed only at the pedestrian crossing
- That they need to be extra careful on the pavements when they are busy, as they have been narrowed

Arrangements for the end of term and in January

The last day of term is Thursday 21st December. School will finish at lunchtime, with students being dismissed between 12:30 and 12:45pm. Gradual dismissal allows all year groups to have a celebratory end of term assembly, with prizes and recognition for those with excellent attendance and to recognise their achievements in school. There will be curriculum teaching on that day also – it is important that students are in school on this day as any other day. This day will be a non-uniform day, raising money for the homelessness charity Shelter. Students will be able to get lunch before they leave, and all students will need to be off the school site by 1:00pm.

On **Monday, 8**th **January school will start with registration at 9:35am** and lessons to begin period 2. All students must be on site by 9:30am. This is true for all students including 6th form, as there are equivalent arrangements in other LaSWAP schools.


Must Read


Honouring Benjamin Zephaniah who has sadly passed away this month, the must read book this week is *Talking Turkeys*.



"He nudged people into seeing the world through the eyes of the oppressed" - Michael Rosen on Benjamin Zephaniah.


