Dear families,

Attendance update

Congratulations so far this term to 7B, 8L, 10B, 10K, 11L and 11K for having the highest or joint highest attendance in their year groups. As I say each week, full attendance at school is critically important for students to succeed academically and to have strong wellbeing, and all students must attend school each day.

Uniform code - response to consultations

Following consultation with students and families, the uniform code was discussed at a governing body meeting in December and some changes were made, particularly to accommodate student comfort in hot weather. The new uniform code is effective immediately and can be found at <u>William Ellis School - Uniform</u>. Governors were clear in their discussions that the blazer is an important and distinctive part of school identity and should be kept as part of the uniform, and were in agreement with students that there should still be different blazers for Key Stage 3 and 4, and different ties for each year group.

There are no changes to the compulsory uniform items that need to be purchased or what supplier they can be bought from, so there is no additional cost to families and items will not be wasted. Almost all items can be bought from generic high street or online providers. They can also be purchased second hand, including from regular WESPA re-sales of school specific and generic items. Families who are struggling with the cost of uniform should let the school know, via the tutor or the Head of Year. We may be able to arrange financial support and we have a small supply of uniform that we can give to students who are most in need.

I realise that there were some parents and students who were concerned about the environmental impact of buying uniforms. We have worked to minimise this by giving families choice about where almost all the uniform can be purchased and continue to engage with our current suppliers about the environmental impact of the products that do come from their website. This policy is now settled and won't be reviewed again even if we changed to a different supplier.

Net zero 2030

As sustainability and environmental impact were a part of the uniform consultation response, it seems timely to update you on the wider work in the school to reduce our overall carbon footprint. There is a national ambition that all schools will be at net zero emissions by 2030.

Today I shared with the Year 10 and 11 Student Council data on our electricity use. We have invested in monitoring systems that show us where and when electricity is being used in the school. They have been set the challenge of finding out where and how we are using unnecessary energy, especially at the end of the school day, so that we can change our everyday habits as a school community. This term we will also start to analyse data on gas consumption and upgrade the systems that control our heating so that this can also be reduced.

We know that other Camden schools with new buildings have solar panels that support their energy supply. We are exploring how we might be able to work with organisations and companies who support schools with older buildings to install renewable energy supply infrastructure. Thank you to the small number of parents who work in this industry who have offered their professional expertise to support this work.





















The Mill Working Weekends 2024 Alice and Sam, Mill Wardens
