# Exam Procedures

- **In MORNINGS – go to your REGISTRATION room as usual**
- **You will be sent from form rooms to the BAG DROP room**
- Go to **BAG DROP (Room 32)** in silence when told, to put **bags, earphones, watches and mobile phones** in. Once bags are dropped off goto the exam room
- You **MUST KNOW** your seat in advance
- **Take your equipment with you**
- Please do follow instructions when in corridors and waiting to enter the Hall
- **Talk stops at the door as soon as you get in the Hall**
- **Calm / silent entrance to exam room essential**

# In the Hall

- **Once in the hall, no talk .**
- Go to your place look for your card number/name on the table. There will be a seating plan on the doors so you can see where you are going to be seated
- **Sit down and wait in silent for instructions.**
- Listen Carefully to instructions.
- **If you are seen communicating in any way or form regardless the reason, Invigilators will not warn you but will report to the school. If talking during and after exam when in the hall although you will be asked to be silent pupils will still be disqualified and will get 0. We will call parents and letter will be sent home directly.**

# 7 Principles of Effective Revision

Effective revision is key to academic success. However, you have to know how to revise. Follow these seven principles, and they will set you on the road to success.

- 1. Make a long-term plan:** All of the revision you have to do can seem intimidating, so stop worrying, and start planning. Create a day-by-day plan scheduling exactly what you want to revise when and stick to it.
- 2. Do not just re-read information:** The least effective type of revision is re-reading notes. Highlighting notes is no better. Both approaches are too passive. You need to be doing something active with your brain to ensure that the information sticks.
- 3. Quiz yourself:** For 'finger-tip' knowledge such as historical dates, Spanish verb endings, or chemical formula, you need to practise recalling information from memory using quizzes. How? flashcards, phone apps, and knowledge organisers.
- 4. Stay mentally active:** If you are thinking hard, you are revising well. Therefore, devise tasks that allow you to practise the thinking you have to do in the real exam. How? Write plans for practise questions, create mind maps, and complete past papers.
- 5. Create Memory aids:** For that really difficult information that just won't stick, create a memory aid. This can be a silly joke, a mnemonic, or a visual representation. Find out what works for you, and use it.
- 6. Focus on the hard stuff:** It is tempting to revise topics you already know, as it feels nice and reassuring. However, this is 'comfort blanket' revision. Put away the comfort blanket and focus on the topics you find difficult. That is where the biggest gains are made.
- 7. Work hard, then have a break:** Either be revising, or on a break. Put your phone away, turn off your music, and close that internet browser. Then, when you have completed your revision, you can have fun. But don't try to mix the two.
