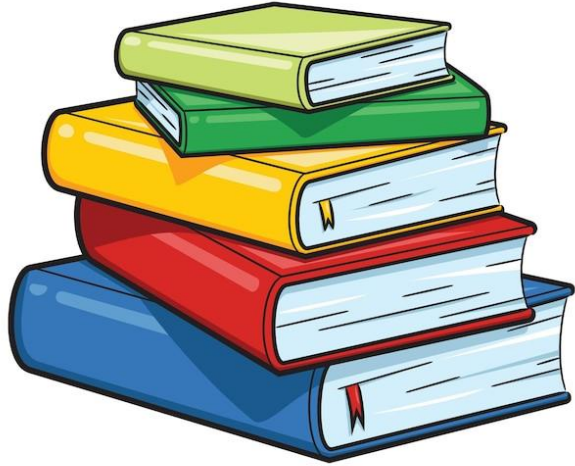

- ☐ Photograph of you reading a book in an interesting or unusual location (challenge 7)

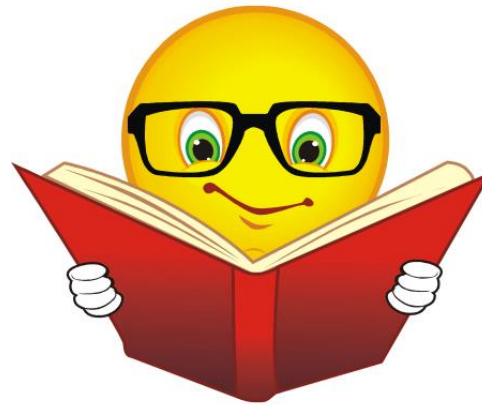
Challenge 1:

Create your own version of a character or scene from a book you have read.

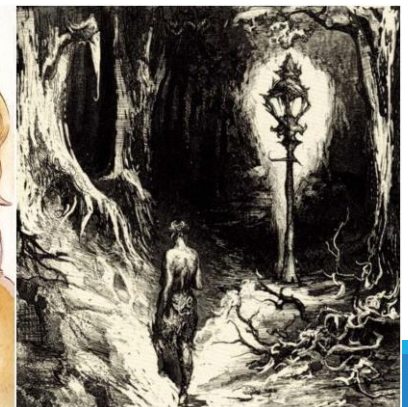
Finished pieces should be returned directly to Ms. Nunnery in the library at the start of the new year.

Challenge 4: Book Review



Read a book and write a review that could be used in our library next year to recommend the book to other students.

Extension: if appropriate, watch an adaptation of the book and compare the movie and the book. Which was better and why?

Challenge 5: Book Bingo!

Try to complete as many squares as possible over the summer holidays. Colour in/Cross out the square when you have done the challenge and write down the title of the book for each square. Hand your bingo card to Ms. Nunnery in the library on your return to school.

Listen to a story (YouTube, audiobook)	Read a book you wouldn't normally choose to read	Borrow a book from our Eplatform	Read a popular book that you've not read before
Read a recommended book	Read for 40 minutes	Read a chapter of a book to someone in your house	Read a book based on a fairy-tale
Read a book by your favourite author	Read a graphic novel or comic book	Listen to a book read by the author (E.g.: David Walliams)	Read in your PJs
Read a book set in a school	Watch an adaptation of a book	Read a book chosen for you by a parent/carers	Read a book you have borrowed from your local library

Challenge 6:

Reading linked to a subject

Is there a particular subject you like in school?

This challenge requires you to read a book that is linked to your favourite subject in school.

You should then complete a task linked to the subject/book.

Some examples:

1. Science: re-read the book *George's Secret Key to the Universe*, make a comic strip about black holes?
2. English: Newspaper report on an incident from a book
3. History: Read a book based on an event in history. Complete a history fact sheet about this event afterwards



Challenge 7: Reading Photo Challenge

Are you going on holiday this summer?

It's the perfect time to escape with a good book, or two!

This challenge requires you to take a picture of yourself reading a book in an interesting place.

If you are not going on holiday, think creatively! Where could you (***safely***) take a picture of yourself reading?
